CONTRACT FOR PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES
TO THE DARLINGTON COUNTY DETENTION
CENTER

This contract is made this 17th day of September, 2015, between Hartsville Medical Enrichment Services (HMES) and the Darlington County Sheriff's Office, AKA, the Darlington County Detention Center (DCDC). Subject to the terms and conditions hereof, it is hereby agreed and herein agreed that HMES will provide healthcare services to the DCDC.

Section 1. GENERAL TERMS AND REQUIRMENTS

HMES will only be responsible for inmate health care inside DCDC after HMES has determined that the inmate has been medically stabilized and has approved commitment to the DCDC, in accordance with the standards established by the National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC).

HMES shall identify the need, schedule, coordinate, administer, and pay for all physician services rendered to inmates inside DCDC. At a minimum, HMES shall identify medical professionals who shall conduct sick call and generally provide such care as is available to indigent patients in the community.

HMES shall identify the need, schedule, administer, and coordinate and pay for all non-emergency and emergency medical care rendered to inmates inside DCDC when HMES medical personnel are on site.

HMES shall administer basic and appropriate emergency medical care at the DCDC to any employee or visitor of DCDC who requires such care when HMES medical personnel are on site.

HMES shall identify the need, schedule, coordinate, administer, and pay for all supporting diagnostic examinations and laboratory services as ordered by HMES personnel for inmates who are treated by HMES inside the DCDC, except, HMES will not be responsible for any medical testing or obtaining samples which are forensic in nature.

HMES shall keep DCDC informed, provide general medical guidance and advice, and advise DCDC of any medical issues that could place inmates and staff in jeopardy.

HMES shall be responsible for all medical health care orders and shall have sole authority to issue health care orders.

HMES shall have sole authority to make diagnosis or referrals to health facilities for inmates requiring more extensive treatment than can be provided by HMES.

HMES shall maintain complete, accurate, and confidential medical and dental records separate from DCDC confinement records of the inmate in compliance with all laws and regulations.

DCDC does not desire 24/7 on-site coverage and accordingly will ensure that DCDC staff notify HMES of medical issues, especially those issues/incidents that arise outside of HMES on-site coverage hours.

DCDC will provide, install, maintain, repair, replace when necessary, and permit HMES to use all medical equipment within DCDC. DCDC will provide, maintain and repair the building structure in areas assigned to HMES, including necessary painting, maintenance of water, steam, refrigeration, sewer, electrical lines, ventilation, air conditioning, lighting, heating, duct work, floor and floor covering, walls and ceiling; provided however, that HMES shall bear the expense of repairs necessary because of the negligence of HMES or its employees.

DCDC will provide all security, pest control, housekeeping, sanitation (including walls, floors, and fixtures but excluding sanitation of equipment and non-disposable supplies), and utilities (including all local telephone costs, Darlington County will provide daily housekeeping services, dietary services, building maintenance services, personal hygiene supplies and services, and linen supplies for each inmate receiving health care services.

DCDC will provide to HMES control of all DCDC medical and office equipment and supplies in place at DCDC's healthcare unit. At the termination of this or any subsequent contract, HMES will return to DCDC control of all supplies, medical and office equipment, in working order, reasonable wear and tear accepted, which were in place at DCDC's health care unit prior to the commencement of services under this contract.

Section 2. SPECIFIC TERMS AND REQUIRMENTS

An inmate shall be considered medically stabilized when the medical condition no longer requires immediate emergency medical care or outside hospitalization so that the inmate can be reasonably and safely housed inside the DCDC, in the sole discretion of HMES.

HMES shall perform a comprehensive health assessment on any inmate confined at DCDC within fourteen (14) calendar days of the arrival of the inmate at DCDC. The assessment shall be performed by a qualified medical professional. The comprehensive health assessment shall include:

- (a) standard history and physical exam;
- (b) screening test(s) for communicable disease;
- (c) urinalysis, as clinically indicated;
- (d) laboratory test(s) directed by the physician for particular medical or health problems, and,
- (e) additional tests as required, based on the original screening tests. And, for female inmates, the health assessment shall include:

- (f) inquiry about menstrual cycle and unusual bleeding;
- (g) review of contraceptive medications the presence of an IUD;
- (h) breast examination and nipple discharge; and,
- (i) pregnancy testing as necessary.

Abnormal health assessment results shall be reviewed by a physician, as appropriate.

HMES will respond to emergent health needs daily and will hold formal sick call three (3) times per week, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

HMES will be responsible for and provide a method of appropriate disposal of contaminated and/or regulated medical waste including needles, syringes, and other materials used in the treatment of inmates.

HMES shall be notified immediately when any inmate is placed on suicide watch and only HMES or its designee may continue or remove an inmate from suicide watch.

HMES shall have authority to approve or disapprove all hospital transports, transfers, releases and admissions, to ensure that inmates are medically suitable and to ensure continuity of care.

HMES shall be responsible for identifying diabetic and renal patients and shall notify DCDC of the needs for special diets, testing and treatment.

DCDC shall be responsible for conducting routing blood sugar testing and medically necessary special diets, during periods outside of HMES on-site coverage hours.

Section 3. POLICIES, PROCEDURES AND RECORDS

HMES shall develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure the delivery of appropriate comprehensive health care in compliance with NCHCC standards, laws, ordinances, and rules and regulations of federal, state, and local authorities as applicable.

DCDC will require a co-pay for sick call of at least \$5.00. However, no inmate will be denied medical care based on his or her ability to pay this fee.

DCDC will require a co-pay of \$3.00 for over-the-counter medications that are approved by HMES, in accordance with Section 7, below.

DCDC will require that inmates pay for all medical services related to self-inflicted injuries.

DCDC will require that inmates have at least \$125.00 in their inmate account, before HMES will be required to schedule any non-emergency dental care.

HMES will consult with DCDC before establishing, changing or implementing any policy or procedure that may impact the operation of the DCDC or the legal duties/responsibilities of the Sheriff of Darlington County.

HMES will allow access to medical records, in accordance with applicable laws and in connection with criminal or civil litigation where the physical condition of an inmate is at issue or when medical care is at issue.

HMES shall provide the sheriff or his designee with access to such records, and upon request, provide copies as authorized by law.

Section 4. STAFFING/COVERAGE

HMES shall provide appropriate and qualified health care professionals to visit DCDC as needed to provide comprehensive medical care, i.e., diagnosis, treatment, prescription of appropriate medications and/or other treatment as may be indicated.

HMES shall provide a covering physician or qualified health care professional to be on call to provide guidance for emergency treatment of inmates at the DCDC seven (7) days per week, twenty-four (24) hours per day.

HMES shall provide the following professional staffing coverage, in accordance with NCCHC standards:

- (a) On site nurse - 12 hours per day, seven days per week;
- (b) Provide physician, physicians' assistant, or nurse practitioner - 7 hours per week;
- (c) On site certified health authority - two times per week; and,
- (d) On site mental health professional - as needed.

HMES agrees that in the event DCDC, in its discretion, is dissatisfied with any of the individual subcontracted physicians or personnel provided under this contract, DCDC may give written notice to HMES of such fact and the reasons thereof. If the problem cannot be resolved, HMES will remove the individual about whom dissatisfaction has been expressed by the DCDC and make arrangements to cover that position until other appropriate personnel can be found.

Inmates shall not be employed or otherwise engaged by either HMES or DCDC in the direct rendering of any health care services.

DCDC shall notify HMES within one hour, if HMES staff fail to report to work after a period without on-site coverage.

Section 5. EXCLUSIONS AND INCLUSIONS

HMES shall be responsible for providing health care services only for inmates in the actual physical custody of DCDC while inmates are confined

within the DCDC. No other inmates, including those in hospitals or those who were hospitalized prior to commitment to the DCDC, shall be the responsibility of HMES.

HMES shall not be responsible for the cost of any medical treatment or health care services provided to any person/arrestee prior to formal booking and commitment into DCDC.

HMES will not be responsible for the costs of any medical treatment or health care services provided to medically stabilize any inmate presented at booking with a life-threatening injury or illness or in immediate need of emergency medical care. When an arrestee/potential inmate has received medical care or has been involved in an accident or other event that may have impacted the health of the potential inmate, DCDC shall notify HMES for a determination as to acceptance of that inmate into DCDC.

HMES shall have sole authority for accepting an inmate into DCDC following medical treatment, an accident, any illness or any other event that may have impacted the health of the potential inmate.

HMES shall not be responsible for health care costs for the following inmates:

- (a) inmates on any sort of temporary release, including, but not limited to, inmates temporarily released for the purpose of attending funerals or other family emergencies;
- (b) inmates on escape status; and,
- (c) inmates on pass, parole or supervised custody who do not sleep in DCDC at night.

HMES shall not be responsible for the cost of medical services related to any injury or illness incurred by inmates who were while on temporary release, while on escape status or while on pass, parole or other supervised custody outside of the DCDC.

HMES shall not be financially responsible for costs associated with significant changes in treatment standards including, but not limited to, changes associated with the approval of new drugs/drug classes and/or changes associated with new diagnostics tests or new surgical procedures if such costs are expected to exceed two percent (2%) of the contract amount exclusive of population increases.

HMES shall not be responsible for the cost of HIV/AIDS medications or Hepatitis C medications.

HMES will not be responsible for providing elective medical care to inmates. "Elective medical care" means medical care which, if not provided, would not, in the opinion of HMES's Medical Director, cause the inmate's health to deteriorate or cause definite harm to the inmate's well-being. Any referral of inmates for elective medical care must be reviewed by the DCDC and the Sheriff or his designee prior to provision

of such services and HMES will not be responsible for costs of elective care.

HMES shall provide health care services to pregnant and post-partum inmates, but HMES shall not be responsible for the costs of pre-natal care and delivery. HMES shall not be responsible for health care services provided to an infant following birth or for costs associated with the medical care of any infants born to inmates.

Section 6. DENTAL

HMES shall provide a dental screening program for the entire inmate population. The program shall be limited to urgent, emergency cases only.

All other dental service shall be provided off-site and HMES will not be responsible for costs.

Section 7. PHARMACUETICALS

HMES shall provide a comprehensive pharmaceutical system for DCDC including prescription medications and over-the-counter medications, as per attached drug formulary, which shall be updated quarterly.

HMES shall have sole authority for prescribing medications, filling prescriptions, dispensing and administering medication, and record keeping.

HMES staff shall administer all medications within 24 hours of the order, exclusive of weekends and holidays. In appropriate emergency cases, delivery shall be immediate.

In the event that HMES determines that a non-formulary drug is medically necessary, HMES will provide the drug to DCDC at HMES's cost plus a 15% handling charge.

If medication has been prescribed by a private doctor prior to arrest, these medications must be approved by HMES. Medication must be in the correct bottle, with no mixed drugs and dated within three months.

Narcotics are not allowed.

Section 8. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

HMES will provide blood sugar/diabetic testing training for all DCDC staff, as requested by DCDC.

HMES will work with the DCDC staff to provide educational materials and instructions on a variety of necessary medical issues including, but not limited to, CPR and first aid, response to an emergency or disaster conditions, signs and symptoms of mental illness, alcohol and drug withdrawal, chronic illness such as diabetes or epilepsy and transmission of HIV and other communicable diseases.

DCDC's employees may be included in any on-site, in-service offerings which are available to the medical staff.

Section 9. INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY

HMES shall maintain insurance from companies with an AM Best "A" rating, or better, licensed to write business in South Carolina. Such insurance shall be of the type and in the minimum amounts specified below.

Before commencing work under this agreement, HMES shall furnish Darlington County with certificates of all required insurance. Certificates shall indicate the type, amount, class of operations covered, effective date and expiration date.

Commercial General Liability: Policy shall provide coverage for independent HMES operations, contractual liability assumed under the provisions of this contract, products/completed operations liability and broad form property damage liability insurance coverage. The policy shall provide liability limits at least in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, combined single limits, applicable to claims due to bodily injury and/or property damage.

Professional Liability Insurance: Policy shall provide professional liability insurance coverage at least in the amount of \$1,000,000 per claim and \$3,000,000 in the annual aggregate, covering the HMES and its employees.

HMES agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Darlington County, its agents, servants and employees from any and all claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities of any kind whatsoever arising out of the provision of health care services conducted by HMES, it being the express understanding of the parties hereto that HMES shall provide the actual health care services.

The Sheriff shall promptly notify HMES of any incident, claim or lawsuit of which the Sheriff becomes aware and shall fully cooperate in the defense of such claim, but HMES shall retain sole control of the defense while the action is pending, to the extent allowed by law.

Darlington County does hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless HMES, its agents, servants, employees and medical staff from any and all injuries, claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities of any kind arising out of the negligence of the Sheriff/DCDC or any staff and/or employees thereof, including but not limited to the following categories of action or inaction by DCDC:

- (a) when DCDC fails to notify HMES in accordance with DCDC policy and Sections 1-7, above;
- (b) when DCDC fails to seek approval from HMES in accordance with this DCDC policy and Sections 1-7, above; and,
- (c) when DCDC fails to provide appropriate medical diets and/or blood sugar testing as directed by HMES.

Section 10. TERMINATION

This contract may be terminated as follows.

(a) Termination by agreement. In the event that each of the parties mutually agrees in writing, this contract may be terminated on the terms and date stipulated therein.

(b) Termination by Cancellation. This Agreement may be canceled without cause by either party upon sixty (60) days prior written notice. This contract anticipates that the average daily population (ADP) will not exceed 210 inmates.

(c) Annual Appropriations and Funding. This contract may be subject to the annual appropriation of funds by the Darlington County Board of Commissioners. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, in the event that funds are not appropriated for this contract, then DCDC shall be entitled to immediately terminate this contract, without penalty or liability, except the payment of all contract fees due under this contract up to and through the last day of service.

Section 11. TERM AND COMPENSATION

This contract shall be for one year with the option of renewal for two additional one year terms, upon agreement of both parties and upon such additional or modified terms and conditions that are not inconsistent with the original Request for Proposal.

DCDC and Darlington County shall pay to the HMES the annual base amount of \$402,300.00, payable in twenty four equal, bi-monthly installments of \$16,762.50 each.

HMES shall invoice Darlington County fifteen (15) days prior to the period in which services are to be provided.


DCDC and Darlington County agree to pay HMES by the tenth day following the period in which services will be rendered. In the event this Agreement should commence or terminate on a date other than the first -or fifteenth day of any calendar month, compensation to HMES will be prorated accordingly for the shortened period.
