

ORDINANCE #89-10

STREET NAMING AND PROPERTY ADDRESS NUMBERING

This is a small excerpt from the above ordinance concerning E-911 addresses.

Article IV – ADDRESS NUMBERING

C. Assignment, Notification, and Placement of Numbers on Addressed Property

2. Notifications

- a. Written notification of the proper address of each addressed property shall be provided to the owner, occupant, or agent of each property, the postmaster and utility companies.

3. Placement of Address Numbers

- a. Such numbers shall be placed on existing buildings within thirty (30) days after the date of notification. The numbers shall not be less than four (4) inches in height and shall be durable and clearly visible, in contrasting color to the building.
- b. The numbers shall be conspicuously placed immediately on, above, or at the side of the front door of each building so that the property number can be plainly identified from the street and also facing mail delivery traffic on mailboxes (BOTH sides recommended). Whenever any building is situated more than fifty (50) feet from the street line, or whenever view of the house is blocked by trees or shrubs, the property number shall also be placed near the walk, driveway or common entrance to the building and attached to the appropriate structure so as to be easily identified from the street.

Article VII – PENALTIES

- A. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days. Each day in which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.
